Pennsauken Mayor Jack Killion and the Township's Department of Economic Development were on hand for the official ribbon cutting of AFC Urgent Care, located at 6630 S. Crescent Blvd. Franchisees Frank Lauletta, Jr. and Salvatore Lopresti, Sr. feel the high traffic location will be the cure that ails Pennsauken residents under the weather.

"We did quite a bit of research in the Pennsauken area," explains Lauletta. "We think this facility helps meet a real demand and need for urgent care."

"We think there's a pretty good opportunity here," adds Lopresti. "We don't see a lot of medical facilities and we think our service is going to be welcomed in the neighborhood."

American Family Care – AFC for short – is a franchise of more than 200 urgent care facilities across 26 states. The staff at the Pennsauken location includes a doctor, nurse practitioner or physician's assistant, and x-ray technician. There is an x-ray room and a blood lab on site; and an apothecary will be moving

MAYOR'S It's Time To Pay The Rent Here In Pennsauken

As public servants, we must always remember that we're here for the taxpayers of our community. Sometimes it's a little too easy to rest on our laurels; that's why the Township Committee and our administration are reviewing each and every municipal department to determine what can be done better and how we can build on what's successful.

During this process, we noticed that the fees for registering the rental units in town hadn't been updated in about a decade; in fact, the old registration fee didn't even come close to covering the municipal costs for this process. That's why last month, Township Committee voted on an ordinance that amends the pricing for registering rental units in Pennsauken, making these fees more reflective of today's costs.

Pennsauken Township is also partnering with ProChamps to help identify residences that are not single homes, but rental properties flying under the radar. How many times have you wondered about the amount of people really living in one of the homes in town? We've wondered about that too; and we're taking active steps to identify people trying to take advantage of our taxpayers.

Now these new initiatives are not an effort to beat up the many responsible owners of rental properties in Pennsauken. You're providing many of our residents the opportunity to call our

Township home; and we appreciate all that you do to maintain and clean your properties. In fact, our municipal government is doing what it can to make other rental owners meet your high standards.

We'd also be remiss if the Township didn't look at the behavior of tenants themselves. Some folks are great, doing what they can to keep their apartments or rental homes in order and being good neighbors. Others don't, hiding behind the excuse that any upkeep is the responsibility of an absentee landlord. We're looking to change that, putting initiatives in place that hold both tenant and landlord responsible for maintaining these properties, both inside and out. We're all living here together as one community. It's not right that some people refuse to do their fair share to

maintain the quality and curb appeal of Pennsauken neighborhoods. Those content with not doing what's required or attempting to take advantage of others are in for quite the wakeup call.

Finally, we ask that all of our residents act as our eyes and ears in the community. If you think a home on your block is a non-registered rental property, if a rental property isn't being well maintained, or if tenants aren't acting like good neighbors, let us know by contacting our administrative office. We need your help in identifying the issues we're not aware of. Give us a call or shoot us an e-mail; we'll always do our best to help.

On behalf of myself and the entire Township Committee, I wish each and every one of you a Happy Independence Day and an enjoyable rest of the summer.

Local Teens Present Summer Project To Enhance Public Lighting In Delaware Gardens

In May, a group of local teens gave a presentation to local officials and area law enforcement on how a special summer project will create a safer and healthier Delaware Gardens neighborhood.

Young people participating in the Leaders of Promise, a program sponsored by local non-profit UrbanPromise to promote leadership skills and civic engagement in teens, presented their summer action plan, "Let There Be Light," to key stakeholders, including Frank Moran, mayor of Camden; Jack Killion, mayor of Pennsauken Township; Betsy McBride, deputy mayor of Pennsauken Township; Addie Colon, regional public affairs manager for PSEG; and representatives from both the Camden and Pennsauken police departments.

During the meeting, the Leaders of

Promise highlighted the four-week project, which includes conducting an assessment of lighting in the Delaware Gardens neighborhood and making recommendations to Pennsauken Township and the City of Camden for repairs, maintenance, and improvements. The group, who is working in partnership with and under the leadership of Angel Osorio of the District County Collaborative Board, will implement beautification projects that will aid their efforts to improve public safety. The possibility of distributing LED bulbs for porch lights of homes in this specific area was also discussed.

The team of youth prepared a purpose statement for their project: "Our goals for the project are to enhance the neighborhood appearance, bring the community together and improve public safety."

The Leaders of Promise are youth par-

ticipating in civic engagement and leadership development training aimed at preparing them to become future leaders while learning to address health equity issues in their community. They are focused on the Delaware Gardens neighborhood, which bridges the border of Camden and Pennsauken Township. The program is sponsored by UrbanPromise and supported by a grant from New Jersey Health Initiatives (NJHI), the statewide grant making program of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF). through their NJHI: Next Generation Community Leaders initiative. Periodic updates about the teams' progress will be available on UrbanPromise's project page on the NJHI website, njhi.org.

UrbanPromise is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing children and youth with the supports they need to

Westfield Avenue Milling And Paving Project Finished Ahead Of Schedule



Work on a section of Westfield Ave. last month was completed ahead of schedule. Additional work on the road is anticipated for later this year. By Frank Sinatra, AAP Editor

Last month, Camden County began a milling and paving project along a section of Westfield Ave. Based on initial estimates, the work running from 42nd St. to Tinsman Ave. was to take several weeks, weather permitting. However, as the concrete under the street was in much better condition than anticipated, the road work was able to be completed at the end of the month.

This project is just the beginning of a larger initiative designed to mill and pave this well traveled road. The Camden County Engineering Department is in the process of designing phase two of the Westfield Ave. project, which will begin at Tinsman Ave., where the previous work left off, and extend all the way to Route 130. The project will also include work on the railroad crossing north of Sherman Ave., as well as some

underground storm sewer improvements between Hillcrest and Hollinshed avenues.

The scope of the work will be similar to the first phase, with barrier-free ramps being installed at all corners of the sidewalk, followed by the milling and

repaving of the road surface. Two-way traffic will be allowed during the majority of the work; detours are anticipated during the paving process.

Phase two is expected to go out for public bids later this summer. It is also estimated that the barrier-free ramps will

be completed in the fall of this year; and milling and paving to be done in spring of 2019

As the County provides updates on phase two of this project, information will be provided via Pennsauken Township's Facebook page and website.



Got Cut? That's the question asked by the new barbershop of the same name located on River Rd. This fresh, yet classic take on the barbershop/community meeting place is the concept of Joey Lopez, a member of Pennsauken High School's Class of 2002 and a graduate of Empire Beauty School in Cherry Hill.

"I got tired of my mom cutting my

hair, so I started in my mom's basement and built a clientele, cutting hair for friends from high school," explains Lopez. "I started getting experience on my own, learning from my mistakes. It

was a rough paper route."

After graduating, Joey got his first shot cutting hair from Jibril Smitherman, who currently runs Pennsauken High School's cosmetology program. And after 10 years at Classic Barber Shop on Westfield Ave., he was ready to make his "Got Cut?" concept a reality.

"I wanted to bring back the concept of the family-oriented barbershop where the focus is on comfort and communication," says Lopez. "Back in the day, the barber was your therapist, your consultant. People came together and talked. We've lost that culture a bit. I want people to put down their phone and talk to the person to left or right of them."

Joey went on to add that the "Got Cut?" brand, which was established in 2012, evolved from an extremely popular advertising campaign.

"I was trying to figure out a brand and I was watching the 'Got Milk?' commercial and it just hit me. Everyone needs their hair cut. Why not ask?"

The space is segmented into several sections, all designed and constructed by Lopez, often times using recycled materials for a rustic, homey feel that didn't bite into the budget. In addition to the main room with several barber chairs, there's a "Pixar themed" kids cut section, with a play area complete with Nintendo and Super Nintendo gaming systems, activity table, books, and toys. The ceiling there is painted as a tribute to children with autism. There's also the "744 Lounge," which offers a pool table, PlayStation 4, domino table, and dart board. It's named in honor of Joey's father, who was incarcerated from before Lopez's birth and passed away in prison at age 56 while

serving a life sentence.

"The time I spent with him, those 45 minute visits at the prison, they were filled with so much knowledge and wisdom," explains Lopez. "The '744 Lounge' would be the place my dad and I would have come to if he hadn't been incarcerated. I wish that I could have walked into a barbershop with my father. To this day, there's nothing like seeing a father and son come in and leave with a smile on their faces. It's a big deal to me."

With a soft opening three months ago, Joey and the staff at Got Cut? are ready to welcome you to the new family-focused barbershop in town.

"We welcome the community to stop by. You'll get a great experience."

SENIORCORNER Information About New Medicare Identification Cards

Since May, Medicare has been mailing its new ID cards to its 60 million members, replacing the old ones folks have used for years. These new cards no

longer have the beneficiary's Social Security number on it, making it more difficult to be used for identity theft. Replacing the cards for current Medicare members is expected to take about a year; and despite best efforts, some people are still confused about what to do when they get them.

First off, when you receive your new Medicare card in the mail, destroy the old one. Since your old card has your Social Security number, shredding it may

be a good idea.

Second, you'll be able to use your new card immediately. Your benefits will be exactly the same.

Third, these cards are absolutely free. There are some scammers out there pretending to be Medicare representatives, calling beneficiaries demanding that they pay a processing fee. Others are saying that the person is owed a refund from Medicare from a transaction on their old card and asking for a bank account number to process giving the money back. These are tricks to take advantage of you; Medicare will never ask someone to do these things.

If folks have questions about their ID card, they can call Medicare directly at (800) 633-4227.

Continuing To Enhance And Grow Our Vacant Property Initiative

When the Township started the vacant property initiative, one of our first goals was to automate as much of the program as possible, so that our time could be spent on problem solving. Now that we've gotten our registration program automated, it seemed natural for us to move to the next step.

Like any other fee-based program there are those, in our case banks or mortgage companies, who are non-compliant. To that end, we have begun to utilize a program available through ProChamps, our current registration company, called Break Point Enforcement. The simple mission is to notify and enforce our local ordinances and collect any back fees owed by those that are non-compliant.

Break Point pulls the records for all non-compliant property registrations and notifies the responsible parties that they have 30 days to bring the property fees current. If the 30 day deadline is not met, the property will begin to accrue fines of \$1,000 per day for each day that the fee is not brought current. And the best part... it's free! There is no cost to utilize this program.

Instead of using Township resources on mailing letters, paying postage, and tracking responses, we are able to use our time researching more opportunities to get the properties sold and occupied.

Very soon, you will see additional ordinances pertaining to the vacant property initiative. These ordinances are being established to ensure that we have covered all of our bases in every situation as it relates to vacant property registration.

For example, a vacant property is sold and in some cases, contractors or investors may purchase one or more properties. However, just because a property is sold does not mean that it is not still vacant. A contractor or investor may buy two properties, begin working on one to rehab and sell, and then use the proceeds from that sale to work on the second property. While they work on the first property, the second one still remains vacant; it is a registerable property and must be recorded as such.

Also, when the foreclosure process has ended on a property and an amicable agreement has been reached by both parties, we don't have the information on why the foreclosure has ended. It is our hope that the agreement reached is one that will allow the family to stay in their home. But there are also those cases where the mortgage company brings the matter to a close and releases the mortgage back to the owner, because the bank no longer sees value in holding on

to the property. In this case, we have no way of knowing who owns it or who is responsible for the maintenance.

Each of these scenarios places the property in the category of being "deregistered." A deregistered property is one that has been either sold, has its mortgage released, recorded as no longer in default, or for other reasons, no longer has the obligation to renew their registration. When we don't have the registration, we also don't have the property maintenance company information, which is the most important piece of this process.

To resolve some of these situations and to ensure compliance of all vacant properties, Pennsauken Township, together with ProChamps, is working to enhance our current registration program. The enhancements will require the status of occupancy on all "deregistered" properties. If a property is found to be vacant after being deregistered, the responsible party will be directed to a registration page and required to register the property as such. This will help ensure that we have the tools in place to register these types of vacant properties.

No matter what else is happening with vacant properties, the most important resource we have is our concerned citizens. The calls and e-mails that you send with information or questions pertaining to a foreclosed, vacant, or abandoned property near you or one that you are interested in purchasing, goes a very long way to helping us get and keep them maintained. Don't assume that we already know of a particular house or situation. Please use the e-mail link on the Township website or call our office and tell us about it.

Of late, we have been receiving many calls regarding tall grass or weeds and such. Information provided by residents can help identify a vacant property that we may not have known about otherwise. Please don't hesitate to let us know

about these situations.

Remember that when you call about a vacant property with landscaping issues, we are required by law to give the owner, bank, or property maintenance company five days to resolve the issue. If no action is taken within the five days, we will place the property on the Township's cut list and our contractor will correct the violation. This process usually takes about 10 days, start to finish.

All the help and information we receive from you is greatly appreciated. Have a safe and wonderful holiday!

in as a tenant right next door.

"We do all minor procedures here at the facility," says Lauletta. "You're in and out in about 45 minutes to an hour and [the fee] is about 10 percent of the cost of going to the emergency room."

"We don't try to take patients from doctors," adds Lopresti. "We tell people to go see their primary physician for a follow up. We're here for when you need to see a doctor right away but can't see your primary."

"We welcome AFC Urgent Care to

Pennsauken and wish them a lot of success," says Pennsauken Mayor Jack Killion. "The facility here is very impressive and will be a great resource for our residents who need more immediate care for non-emergency situations."

"They still may be sick, but they'll leave with a smile on their faces," says Lauletta.



The Pennsauken Sewerage Authority is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the sanitary sewage collection system in our service area. The sanitary sewage collection system is made up of main lines, force mains and pumping stations.

The homeowner owns and therefore is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the lateral line from their dwelling up to and including the connection to the main line.

The rules and regulations of the Pennsauken Sewerage Authority require a back

flow prevention device commonly referred to as a "back check valve" be installed whenever plumbing fixtures are located below street level, such as in the basement. PSA strongly recommends all our customers have a back check valve installed to prevent contamination in the event of a main line stoppage.

The discharge of water collected in a sump pit to the sanitary sewage collection system is prohibited.

Cooking grease poured down the drain can cause a blockage of the lateral line. Please dispose of grease properly.



GOINGGREEN Daylilies: An Explosion of Summer Color

The following is a reprint of Kat's column from July 2015.

Few plants are as rugged, widely adaptable, or versatile as daylilies. Of exceptionally easy culture, these longlived stalwarts of the garden come in every hue but blue. Flower color palette includes yellow, orange, red, white, and purple flowers; many varieties contain more than one color. With thousands of cultivars available, there is a size, blooming season, and flower color for every garden. Today's daylilies aren't just the

Hemerocallis, the botanical name for daylily, means "beautiful for a day" in Greek. The flowers of most species open at sunrise and wither at sunset, and may be replaced by another flower on the same scape (flower stalk) the next day. Established clumps bloom vigorously for several weeks. Daylilies are

orange "ditch lilies" of yesteryear.

awesome in midsummer, blooming in the heat when other plants are stressed.

Depending on the species and cultivar, daylilies can grow in most of the country. Several varieties have multicolored blooms, often with a contrasting center, referred to as the eve or throat. Multicolored cultivars are becoming increasingly popular. Newer hybrids may have an additional ring of contrasting color in the center of the petals, forming an additional circle of color. Flower shape also varies. Elongated petals widely spaced are known as spider lilies. Ruby Spider, a large, deep velvety red spider lily, resides in my garden. Some flower petals overlap, forming a full, more rounded look. Then there are my favorite, with full, ruffled, overlapping petals. Swoon!

Most daylilies have a distinct, three-to four-week bloom period in early to late summer. Early, mid-season and late varieties are available. By planting daylilies

from each group, it is possible to have an almost continuous bloom throughout the summer. Some varieties even rebloom in the fall, for a second show before going dormant for the winter.

Once established, daylilies are hardy, heat and drought resistant, and pest resistant. These qualities have made them garden staples. Daylilies do well in a wide range of well drained soils, but prefer a deep, fertile loam in full sun to part shade, with a pH approaching neutral. Soils rich in organic matter, such as homemade compost, encourage profuse blooming. Many of the older hybrids will grow well even in the sandy soils of our area.

Fertilize lightly once the plants are established, but avoid using mixes high in nitrogen. Avoid excessive fertilizing, as this will encourage huge plants, but inhibit flower production. Apply a thin layer of compost each spring, followed by a two-inch thick layer of mulch to re-

tain moisture, help maintain an even temperature around the roots, and control weeds. Water plants around the base of the plant during the growing season if rainfall is less than one inch per week.

While blooming, deadhead (remove) spent flowers daily for neatness and remove scapes (blooming inflorescences) when flowers have completed their bloom cycle and no more buds appear. Daylilies should be divided periodically to maintain vigor. When the clumps become overcrowded, typically every three to five years, it is time to divide. When daylilies break dormancy and new growth begins in the spring, lift the entire clump, carefully divide into groups of two or three fans, replant what you want, and share or trade extras with other daylily enthusiasts.

With a little time and care, your garden will explode with color.

have sent many a nanny packing before Mary Poppins arrives on their doorstep. Using a combination of magic and common sense, she must teach the family members how to value each other again.


